



Carole Goldberg is the Jonathan D. Varat Distinguished Professor of Law and Vice Chancellor, Academic Personnel at UCLA, where she has taught Federal Indian Law, Tribal Legal Systems, the Tribal Legal Development Clinic, the Tribal Appellate Court Clinic, and Civil Procedure. She also serves as a Justice of the Court of Appeals of the Hualapai Tribe, and as a hearing officer for the Morongo Band of Mission Indians. She has published articles and books on a wide range of subjects in federal Indian law and tribal law, including state jurisdiction on reservations under Public Law 280, individual rights issues in Indian country, and the constitutionality of federal and state classifications favoring Indians. Through her work with UCLA's Tribal Legal Development Clinic, she has assisted Indian nations in drafting their constitutions, legal codes, and intergovernmental agreements. In 2011, President Barack Obama appointed her to serve on the Indian Law and Order Commission.
